Good afternoon and welcome to your weekly St Ethelwold's newsletter.

As I am sure you have heard by now, we were forced into the difficult decision of cancelling the school performances which were scheduled for this week because of the ongoing situation with scarlet fever. Having spoken at length to Public Health Wales, we took the decision due to the high level of chicken pox within school at the moment, especially as the mixture of chicken pox and scarlet fever are known to potentially cause medical concerns. On top of that, we were running at around 60% pupil attendance last week and unsure who will be in school this week. We hope that you understand the situation that we are in and, as mentioned in the email that went out on Wednesday, we will try to get videos of the children performing to you in the next couple of weeks.

Public Health Wales (PHW) told us to expect a rise in the number of cases of Scarlet Fever in school in the coming weeks so please do be vigilant and refer back to Wednesday's Warn and Inform letter from PHW for the signs that you should be looking out for.

Christmas Jumper Day was enjoyed by everyone on Thursday, and we raised a little bit of money for Save the Children charity. Thank you to everyone who brought their £1 donation in - we have £26 to send the charity.

With the cold weather snap that we are experiencing at the moment, we are gritting the paths and playground each morning and whilst the grit is fast acting and is thawing most of the ice, there may still be icy patches around. Please do take extra care at drop off an pick up time as the temperature is typically colder at these times of our school day.
