Good afternoon parents and carers and welcome to your weekly newsletter from St Ethelwold's Primary School.

We welcomed back Dylan Jones this week. Dylan has run Prince William Award sessions for us in the past and returned to set up a Character Development Awards programme with our Year 3 and Year 4. The 36 week programme looks at building up the key skills of resilience, teamwork and personal development and the results from our previous programmes with Dylan have been exceptional. We look forward to another year where we see the true characters of our younger juniors coming through.

We have entered a mixed football team into the Mountain League this year. In previous years we have played against exceptionally large local schools and whilst we have more than held our own, we think that pitting our team against schools of similar size is a much fairer representation of their abilities. In preparation for our Harvest Service next week, we have a Harvest Table in our school hall. We look forward to our pupils in foundation phase putting into practise what they have learned.

We would like to introduce The Daily Mile for all the children and staff in St Ethelwold's and ensure its health and wellbeing benefits are available for everyone. As a school we are excited about this new initiative and we are looking forward to the benefits it will bring to your child/children. Every child in a school or nursery goes out each day in the fresh air to (run/walk or jog at their own pace for 15 minutes). It is not competitive though some will compete and that is fine. Most children will average a mile in the 15 minutes, with some doing more and some doing less. It is not PE, sport or cross-country but physical activity in a social setting which is aimed at improving the children's physical, social, emotional and mental health, and wellbeing. The children run in their ordinary school clothes with trainers being ideal but not essential. It can help children to focus and concentrate in the classroom and raise their attainment. And most importantly, the children really enjoy it.
