School on the Up!

Where has that half term gone? It seems like only yesterday that I was frantically searching the shops for school uniform for my children and telling them that 'growing room' was fashionable. This school has achieved a great deal in the last 8 weeks, and it is only when we take a step back to evaluate that you realise what we have accomplished as a strong, dedicated and committed team.

In just 8 short weeks we have:

- · Introduced and embedded a whole school approach to marking and feedback that allows pupils to make progress in their learning in each and every lesson.
- · Introduced a tracking system in maths which allows teachers to track the daily progress of pupils and put in extra teaching wherever it is needed.
- · Introduced videos and QR codes in Welsh oracy (speaking and listening) which allows pupils to make improvements to their work.
- · Introduced iPad technology which allows teachers to pinpoint errors and address immediately.
- · Introduced a school wide way of planning and teaching literacy which clearly shows a consistent process which can be applied by all children.
- · Introduced a split outdoor area in foundation phase which allows our very young pupils to explore their surroundings without being intimidated by the size of some of our older pupils.

The above is just the tip of the iceberg and we have introduced many more initiatives and systems which are having a significant impact on the progress and achievement of your children. To showcase what we are doing, you are very warmly invited to an OPEN DAY on Tuesday 26th November. During the day, the teachers will teach a normal day so that you are able to see the challenge that pupils receive, the excellent teaching going on, the behaviour of our pupils and the incredible educational gains made by our pupils. We are very proud of our school and would like you to celebrate the journey with us. We will also invite you to stay for lunch during the day and Mrs Duggan will give you further details of this.

Dog Mess Tackled!
