His actions breathe new life into the landscape and bring the community back together. As a result of this learning, we have ordered trees from The Woodland Trust which class 3 will plant around the school grounds. Once again we are seeing the development of **Ethical Informed Citizens of Wales and the World.**

Covid-19 Update

Thank you so much to you all for playing your part in ensuring school is running as smoothly as possible during this trying and testing time. We have heard about positive cases in many local schools but thankfully we have not yet had a case at St Ethelwold's.

Rest assured though, we are primed and ready to put into action our contingency plans if and when we have a positive case. The first thing that will happen is that we will send you a text to tell you to come to school immediately to collect your child if they are in the same class as the child with confirmed COVID-19. If we get contacted during the weekend or evening, we will instruct you not to bring your child to school for a period of 14 days. Public Health Wales, the Track, Trace and Protect Team and The Environment Agency will then speak to us and establish if any other individuals should self-isolate. We will of course communicate this information with you as soon as we get it.

We are now living under local lockdown and we offer you this prayer in these uncertain times.
